



Kimball Carriages

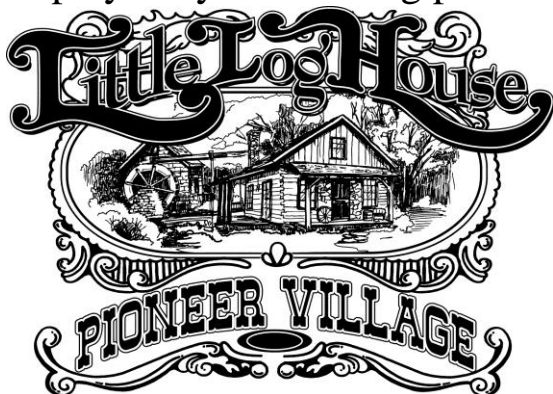
Ford, General Motors, and Chrysler were the big automobile manufacturers and make up the industry today. Brewster, Kimball, and Studebaker were the big manufacturers of horse drawn vehicles in that day. While Brewster was considered “the Cadillac” of carriages, there were those that would argue that a Kimball could claim that title.



Beginning in 1634 and continuing until 1929, nine generations of the Kimball family were involved in the carriage industry. In January of 1877 Charles Porter Kimball took over the Coan & Ten Brocke Mfg. C. of Chicago Illinois, the nameplate on his carriages was “C.P. Kimball & Co Chicago.
